**Call to Order**

Chairman Hull called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Chairman Hull gave the Zoom information and instructions for providing public input.

**Scheduled Appointments**

**Chief of Police Interview - Shawn P. Cronin**

The recommendation from Public Safety Consultants was read into the record by Chairman Hull.

Chairman Hull said please begin by telling us about yourself? Why are you interested in becoming Dighton's next Police Chief.

Lt. Shawn Cronin said he has had the fortune of working with some of the best throughout the town and the state. He said we are on a different path. Lt Cronin said he loves the town and his kids are the 5<sup>th</sup> generation to grow up in Dighton.

Selectman Caron asked, "Given that the Police Chief heads the entire department, he/she is a public leader in the community. The Chief should be fair, have high levels of integrity and carry himself or herself in a way that sets the example and inspires. The Police Chief should also have superb leadership, communication and collaboration skills. How do the qualities that you possess help meet these expectations?"

Lt. Cronin said, leadership is sacrifice, it is a way of life and not something that we take for granted. There is a lot of pride in the Police Department and he was proud to be right there with them.

Selectman Pacheco said that he had an opportunity to work together in the past in the court system.

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Selectman Pacheco said, tell us about your vision and the priorities that you will bring to the Dighton Police Department as our new Chief of Police.

Lt. Cronin said he would continue to work on the culture within. He said we have a pretty good thing going. Secondly, he wanted to be sure that everyone is okay with reform and to make sure the department is well informed to relieve some of the stress. He said reviewing policies, adopting new ones and drafting new ones and making sure that we align on the policies being put in place.

Chairman Hull asked what do feel are the Police Departments greatest strengths?

Lt Cronin said the people. He said we are a humble department. When we have to be firm, we are firm. Our biggest attribute is being real.

Selectman Caron asked, "what are the biggest challenges facing the Police Department today?"

Lt. Cronin said there are a lot of challenges. A lot of perceptions. We are under the microscope every day. You are always against the perception of the what is happening. Unfortunately, our biggest challenge is being looked at

Selectman Caron asked specifically about the department's challenges and what are the biggest challenges facing the Police Department.

Lt. Cronin said he would like to engage the officers in more trauma awareness. Who knows what some people have gone through in the past couple of years. Training about what kids have been going through, financial issues. Being informed about trauma issues

Selectman Pacheco asked about Lt. Cronin's greatest strength and his greatest weakness.

Lt. Cronin said as I get older, I realized that you must change and adapt and I have that ability. He said the why is always important. The dynamic changes daily.

Chairman Hull asked about collaboration and how he would approach these efforts.

Lt. Cronin said if he was given the opportunity, he would be walking into a very solid foundation. It is pretty encouraging. It is important that everyone is on board.

Selectman Caron asked Lt. Cronin how he would introduce himself to the department and to the broader community as the new Police Chief.

Lt. Cronin said he was a big believer in social media to get things out there that you wouldn't normally be able to convey to the public. In his opinion, that would be a gateway into introduction.

Selectman Pacheco asked Lt. Cronin about his biggest personal challenge as you make the transition to Police Chief. How would these challenges relate to the Department and its personnel?

Lt. Cronin said maintaining maturity. He said we all have responsibilities and we all have things that we need to get done. He said maintaining the understanding of professionalism and responsibility.

Chairman Hull asked about budget management and asked Lt. Cronin to explain the financial controls that would be put in place to achieve this.

Lt. Cronin said this was a big eye-opener for him. Seeing that we didn't catch a couple of things was a pride thing. We need to centralize the purchasing. Overall, he thought the Chief had done a great job with the budget over the past years.

Selectman Caron asked where do you see the police department in 5 years.

Lt. Cronin said it is hard to qualify that question, because we are not performance based. He said making sure that everyone stays humble and not lose sight of the fact that the community supports us. That is a major goal. He said there are tools on the horizon in terms of accountability and industry standards such as body cams. It is exciting to navigate through this.

Selectman Caron asked if he thought there was enough officers on staff in five years.

Lt. Cronin said he thought an increase was necessary for the department to stay up to date and serve the public. He said the SRO program was doing some incredible things with the younger generation. Lt. Cronin also said being able to respond and to patrol is a big part of it. He said there are a lot more officers than when I started. He said he hoped the department would grow.

Selectman Pacheco asked about the implementation on police reform, accountability and accreditation efforts have been the focus of significant attention in the Commonwealth. What steps would you take as Chief to continue leading these efforts?

Lt. Cronin said the Chief has been supportive of him attending meetings. Communication is the biggest thing. If they don't understand they know they can come and ask.

Chairman Hull asked about how they will evaluate the managerial efficiency and effectiveness of the Dighton Police Department.

Lt. Cronin said it is empowering your staff. By doing that, you give accountability.

Selectman Caron asked how he felt about the SRO and the comfort dog. How would you lead and strengthen community policing efforts in our community?

Lt. Cronin said his biggest answer is the kids. Having a comfort dog, especially with what everyone has gone through, the comfort dog will be a connection. Today we received three calls to get kids into the next junior police officer's session. We are all human and no one does everything right.

Selectman Pacheco asked how will you assess job performance and motivate personnel at all levels of the organization.

Lt. Cronin said every person has a role. The motivation should take care of itself as long as the morale is there. He said staying on top of that is hugely important and a big responsibility.

Selectman Hull asked if there was anything else that he would like to share.

Lt. Cronin said he thanked Town Administrator Mullen, Karin Brady, his family and everyone in this room. He said we have all worked hard and he would be honored to continue this work.

Chairman Hull said the interview was not only for the board, but for the public to see Shawn Cronin and what he is about.

Chairman Hull said Detective Ryan Richards, Chief Maguy, and others have expressed support for you in this role.

Chief MacDonald thanked the officers for their support. He said when Shawn became lieutenant, he made a lot of changes within the department. He said Lt. Cronin has written grants. Chief MacDonald said he is very professional and he would recommend him all day long.

Chief Macdonald recommended that the Board of Selectmen make Shawn Cronin the next police chief in the town of Dighton.

Selectman Caron thanked Lt. Cronin for his patience tonight and answering all the questions.

Chairman Hull said he would support the recommendation and during his meeting with the School Superintendent, they said they looked forward to working with him as well.

### **Letter from Asher Wheeler on Recreation Programs for Older Teenagers**

A letter was written by Dighton resident Asher Wheeler. It was read by Chairman Hull requesting a hang out space for teens to have fun.

Mr. Kevin Smith, Chair of Parks and Recreation, said we would love to expand programming for all ages. He said anything that we could do, we would be happy to do it.

He said the best way to implement a change is to get involved. He welcomed them to attend Park and Recreation meetings and present any ideas that they had.

Mr. Smith gave some ideas for outdoor spaces. He also thought that during the winter possibly the Prime Time building could be used for some teen programming. He said there were some clubs that may be listed on the B-P website.

Chairman Hull said, what happens in this town is dictated by the interest of people in the town. It comes down to resources. He said Parks and Recreation have meetings once a month. He said suggested they come to Parks and Rec with ideas and proposals, and Mr. Smith will submit to town Administrator for funding. It can be done, but it comes down to ideas and planning

There was discussion about planning and visions

Selectman Caron asked about the fundraiser for pickle ball and how it went. Mr. Smith said they raised about \$500.00 and it was enough to facilitate the equipment that was needed.

Selectman Caron asked what Ms. Wheeler would like to see.

Ms. Wheeler said a specific recreation center with specific events such as movie night. She said her grandmother would be open to volunteering for supervision. She wanted to see something specifically geared to teenagers

Selectman Pacheco said he thought Mr. Smith had some great ideas. He also said that the Library Director had specifically asked for an area in the new library specifically for teens.

## **Town Administrator's Report**

### **Update on Town Accountant Posting Process**

Mr. Mullen said the position has been posted in all pertinent places. He said right now there are 4-5 applicants. He said we will begin screening after July 18.

### **Update on 207 Main Street Acquisition**

Mr. Mullen said we have a closing on 207 Main Street scheduled for July 28. He said we have received the second tranche of ARPA funding to complete the deal. We will have the closing documents and the occupancy agreement for the board to review at the next meeting.

## **Selectmen's Reports**

Selectman Pacheco said the Agricultural Commission is coming up with livestock regulations in town.

Selectman Pacheco said he also met with the Historical Commission and they will be presenting the Boston Post Card Monday August 1, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. at Old Town Hall.

Selectman Pacheco said residents have approved \$25,000.00 for a historical survey.

Selectman Caron said he met with Community Preservation Committee and they postponed until September. He said also attended the Solid Waste Committee meeting.

Mr. Mullen said the committee discussed and approved a mission statement the next meeting is scheduled for August 3, 2022.

Selectman Caron said one thing that was discussed at the first meeting was opening the transfer station on Sunday. Selectman Caron said he did not initially agree with this discussion because he thought it would cost the town money by watering down operations on Tuesday and Saturday.

Mr. Mullen said there was discussion of mattress disposal costs. He said there is a \$90.00 disposal fee for mattresses, compared to our \$15.00 collection fee. He said these issues will need to be addressed because we do not have the ability to absorb the \$75.00 difference.

Chairman Hull said the new superintendent, Bill Runey, and the Dighton High School PTO has been working on School Security Plan.

Chief MacDonald said they would like to schedule a meeting regarding this on July 26, 2022, and they are looking for us to attend.

Mr. Runey will be coming before the Board of Selectmen in August to discuss school security.

Chairman Hull said the DDIC will be holding a business exposition on September 21 at 6:00 p.m. and inviting businesses to locate in Dighton or Berkley. He said they will also be inviting realtors and prospective business owners to see what their feelings are about how Dighton can grow. Chairman Hull said the DDIC has a couple of serious irons in the fire. One involving Shaw's Boatyard. He said at the end of the month two developers will be coming before the DDIC to talk about the possibility of an Industrial Park in town.

Chairman Hull also reminded everyone to the Dighton Water District's water ban. He said the water situation is improving. Chairman Hull said the Water District is strongly urging residents of town to contact the Water District to set up appointments to replace water meters.

**Engagement of Town Labor Counsel-Clifford and Kenny, LLP**

Mr. Mullen said we deal with labor issues on a daily basis. He thought there had been couple of issues where we could have had a different result if the town had a dedicated labor counsel. He said they are a very proactive firm who pledge and pride themselves on working on issues before they get out of control. Mr. Mullen said he thought having dedicated labor counsel would be a huge help

Chairman Hull supported the recommendation.

Selectman Pacheco motioned, Selectman Caron seconded and it was **VOTED** to engage Clifford and Kenny LLP, as town labor counsel.


