B. Violations / Penalties

1) Criminal Disposition

Whoever violates any provision of these Regulations may be prosecuted in a court of competent jurisdiction.

2) Non-Criminal Disposition

Violation of any of the regulations of the Board of Health may be enforced by non-criminal in a manner provided by General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 21D and Section 1-4A.

("Non-Criminal Disposition") of the Town of Dighton Bylaws. This does not limit the Town in any way from seeking criminal or civil remedies at a court of competent jurisdiction. The specific noncriminal disposition penalty which shall apply to a violation of these Board of Health Regulations shall be in accordance with applicable Sanitary and Environmental Codes listed above.


3) Each day any violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.




