

Memo: Update on the Renewal of Dighton Community Electricity Aggregation (CEA) & Transition to New Prices

Thank you for your ongoing support of the Dighton CEA, the Town’s electricity supply program, operating since 2016.

Good Energy is the Town’s consultant helping you manage the program, and this memo provides a short update on the program’s performance, a reminder of the new electricity prices that will go into effect November 2025, and an overview of the outreach efforts to spread awareness of the new prices.

Program Progress:

As a reminder, the goals of this program are to (1) offer additional renewable content supply options, (2) maintain competitive prices, and (3) offer greater price stability.

The Dighton Community Electricity Aggregation program has been active since 2016, providing multiple contract terms of price stability. Most participants use our Dighton Standard option, which has cumulatively saved \$3800000, or about \$1990 for the typical residential customer since launch.

New Pricing:

The renewed prices are decreasing for all products and Dighton CEA’s default supply, Dighton Standard, will cost less than National Grid Basic Service at the time new prices go into effect.

The program’s current electricity supply contract expires in November 2025 and the program was renewed after a competitive bidding process with the same supplier, **Constellation**.

All new Dighton CEA prices will be fixed for 36 months, from November 2025 until November 2028:

Dighton Standard	Dighton Plus
14.346 ¢/kWh No additional renewable energy (63% in 2025)	15.475 ¢/kWh Adds renewable energy to total 100% (100% in 2025)
Our lowest priced option.	Go above and beyond! Put more renewables onto the grid than you consume.

The Transition to New Pricing:

Program participants will automatically receive the new pricing for their current product, with the exception of any customer that has placed a “supplier block” on their account with National Grid cannot be transitioned. They will need to call National Grid to remove the block themselves.

New pricing takes effect on the November 2025 meter read. Participants will see this change on the bill they receive showing usage from November 2025 to December 2025, which most residents will receive in December 2025.

Additional Ways to Save:

While prices are dropping, we know that customers may want even lower prices.

1. Participants may switch to another Dighton CEA option at any time. Dighton Standard is the lowest priced option in the program. To switch options, call our program’s current electricity supplier, Constellation, at (833) 461-0813 or submit a request at MassCEA.com/Dighton.
